>> Sure, it's simple if you're using only the web proxy client.

>> The ISA 2000 server performs all DNS resolution for web proxy clients.

Add

>> an entry in the HOSTS file on the ISA 2000 server, something like

>>

>> 172.16.2.3 earth.google.com

>>

>> and save the file (no extension!) In about eight hours ISA will stop
using

>> the cached DNS entry and start using the HOST file entry.

>> Basically you're making the DNS lookup stop working by sending it to an

>> invalid address. I do this with IM products all the time. They still can

get

>> to it by IP address if they're educated enough, though.

>> Make sure you do not do this:

>> 127.0.0.1 earth.google.com
>>
>> if you require web proxy authentication. When they try to go to that URL,
>> ISA will pop up an authentication dialog because it thinks someone is trying
>> to log on locally. That will generate Help Desk calls.
