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Dear Cengiz,

Thanks for posting here.

Based on my knowledge, this behavior is probably caused by the "Applies To" setting on the ISA server. When you set the "Applies To" of the "Protocol Rules" to some restricted user accounts, the ISA server will identify the users. This identification is integrated with the firewall client and the logon accounts. When the non-domain client computer connects to the ISA server, the firewall service doesn't prompt the authentication dialog box and then the FWC connection will fail. Otherwise, the non-domain computers can get an authentication dialog box when access the Internet via proxy because the web access is provided by the Web Proxy Service; the "HTTP proxy required authentication" protocol is supported by the Web Proxy Service and the Internet browser. This is a by-designed behavior.

As a workaround, you may set the "Applies To" of the "Protocol Rules" to "All requests" if you need to connect the non-domain computers with the ISA server by using FWC.
