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Hi Saira,

If the DHCP server is on the Internal network on the "on subnet" network ID of the internal interface, then the default System Policy will allow the ISA firewall to access the DHCP server and obtain addresses from the scope you created.

: a list of IP addresses to issue to VPN clients.

: I obviously have an issue with my access rule, but i do not know what I am doing wrong.

: My understanding was that if the DHCP System rule pointed to the DHCP

: servers, this should be sufficient to allow the server to pick up addresses.

: This did not work.

: I tried as an experiment to allow all outbound traffic from the ISA server

: to the Internal network, this did not make a difference. I then created a

: rule to allow all outbound traffic the other way. Suddenly the server was

: receiving IP addresses.

: What is it that I need to set?

: P.S. creating a rule that allows DHCP request and reply from the local host

: to the internal DHCP server does not do it either.
