> [Is the problem equal and consistant on all workstations, or is this just
> one? Is the Windows Firewall running on them? \(if so, shut it off\)](#)

> [In the FWC folder there is a file CHKWSP32. Open a command prompt window,
> change to the correct folder \(probably "c:\program files\microsoft firewall
> client"\). Run it with "chkwsp32 /f" and see what it comes up with.](#)

> [At the moment I really don't know...maybe I'll think of something in the

> [I thought I remembered some article about the FWC not finding the ISA after
> it was installed, but I may have to hunt around for it.](#)

> [In the meantime, you could get by running them as SecureNAT Clients which
> already seemed to had been working....they just require the Access Rule to](#)

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> be for All Users (anonymous) instead of a specific Group....and of course
> the ISA must either be the Default Gateway of the Clients or be in the
> "Routing Path" if it is a multi-segment network. The "All Users" Rule would
> only need to be for POP3/SMTP and the destination would only need to be the
> ISP's mail server but no other.
