What bothers me is that the error you are receiving does not reference isa anywhere. Typically if you are being denied access by a rule it would be obvious that isa was stopping you. I would like to rule out that the proxy name is correct in ie. Can you change the proxy name value to the internal ip address of the isa server and try again.

Kevin, this is the message the IE7 is giving with the proxy turned on in the IE settings.
