Imagining that all of the cookies associated with a given browser constituted a 'cookie context': is it possible to alter the cookie context of one WBC within an application without altering the cookie context of another WBC instance within the same application?

Extremely difficult. Normally, cookies are managed per-process (session cookies) or per-user (persistent cookies). But see
