- > *want to make sure that the sessions are not accidentally shared*
- > *between the two sets as they are both different applications.*

Not sure I understand this one. If you are concerned about one application stepping on another's variables you can resort to meaningful naming. Otherwise, what exactly is the point?

- > *Right now I'm having a problem when I do a Session.Abandon from one*
- > *set of scripts it also kills the session for the other set of scripts*
- > *(I believe they are both using the exact same session). Is there*
- > *some way I can make sure this doesn't happen?*

Build your own session architecture with a DB backend, perhaps? We actually do this in order to BROADEN our session scope (span servers), but I suppose it could be used to NARROW that scope.
