> One thing I would try is to attach the hard drive to another machine,
> configure it as the primary master and then try to boot and see what
> happens.

> You'll probably (no, in fact you definitely will) get loads of device
> driver conflicts, etc but you may be able to get the machine running
> to such a state where you can retrieve data and maybe even perform an
> IIS migration.

>

> You've got nothing to lose by trying it and merely trying to boot from
> that drive in another machine won't damage the data on it in anyway.
