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How are you denying other users?

Remember: NTFS Permissions the most restrictive applies.

If you deny DOMAIN\USERS (then you have denied yourself since you are a member of that group) and you deny yourself even if you grant yourself full control.

The easiest way to do what you want is to remove all accounts from the permissions list.

Then add your account back in and grant it Change rights.

Then add the SYSTEM account and grant it full control (Not required to work but works better because SYSTEM needs control)

Another better way is this:

Create a new group called FTP Read/Write and add yourself as a user
Then grant the permissions to the group

Hope this helps.
