We have website built in .NET that requires domain users to auththenticate to (www.office.mycompany.com). We want to add an OWA (Outlook Web Access) site that is a subdirectory of the www.office.mycompany.com site, but we do not want users to have to authenticate again to exchange if they go to www.office.mycompnay.com/OWA. Is there a way to do this? What authentication options are available to access both sites while logging in once?
