: there.

: Now the router shouldn't let me get into it from an outside connection
: as I have disabled remote admin and the dir's and virtual dir's on IIS
: and the URL are correct.

: Oh and finally when it did look like it was working downloaded files
: had no size.

Unless you have an internal DNS and put your external domain in it, you will
get your router configuration. Your external DNS points back to your
router, so that is what you get. That is your public IP address everyone
will see. Your router knows to route to your server, but internally, you
don't use the external address, you use an internal one.
