

## Re: "lite" version of IIS 6 for the workstation

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AMD64 and IA64 are completely different and incompatible architectures, so you cannot mix their binaries.

XP Pro IA64 was released at the same time as XP Pro and follows that service schedule (so it would be XP Pro IA64 SP2 now).

XP Pro x64 (i.e. AMD64) is currently in RC2 as AMD64 support is added to both Windows Server 2003 and XP Pro in WS03 SP1.

Sorry for the confusion. It is easier to view AMD64 as a new processor supported by Windows with Windows Server 2003 and its Pro SKU of XP Pro x64, and it is coming out with Windows Server 2003 SP1. IA64 was already supported when XP was released, so it follows that service schedule.

I know almost nothing about 64-bit procs, but I guess the Windows XP 64-bit Edition Version

under the 64-bit Itanium-based Systems heading posted 3/26/2003 is the "IA" version you mentioned?

And Windows XP Professional X64 Edition RC2 posted 2/8/2005 under the 64-bit x64 Edition

Systems heading is the "AMD64" version? Also, if the second version is considered "AMD64",

can it be loaded on Itanium systems as well?

>Anyways, you can get IIS6 on the following platforms (I don't know what is >actually marketed; I know we test IIS6 against these platforms):

>Windows Server 2003, all SKUs

>XP Pro 64bit (both IA64 and AMD64)

>The best bet for a IIS6 dev machine is an AMD64 machine running XP Pro
