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Well, I don't think we can be of much "help", sadly.

The memory leak will slow down a bit if you disable Show Project Gallery at startup, if you switch off WYSIWYG font menus, and if you close the progress window in Entourage.

The equation bug is just that, a bug. There's a Service Pack due out on March 11th, which hopefully will fix it. In the meantime, try to ignore it: the equations should burst back into life with the fix.

Get into the habit of Quitting, rather than minimising, applications when you are not using them.

If you are suffering slow start-up: it's a conflict with OS 10.5.2 and we're waiting for a fix from Apple for that one.

Not much good news, I am afraid.
