Okay Will thanks for the link. Digging into the SMB information, I see where the default domain controller policy has to be set to "disabled" on Digitally Sign Communications.

The default domain policy will not be changed.

Purchasing admit mac would be nice, but wont happen.

Anything else I can do besides running a script locally on the macs at startup?

Ah, at least I think you've found your problem.

If that policy hasn't been disabled then you will not be able to use Mac OS X's built-in SMB client at all to connect to a Windows Server 2003 server. The only alternative is to use an SMB client that is compatible with the policy and that would be either Dave or ADmitMac, which are both from Thursby.

Unfortunately, these are your only two alternatives unless you have a Mac OS X server that can act as the host for the home directory.
