> > corrupt in one way or another. This is very true with any files
> > downloaded
> > from P2P applications like Kazaa, WinMX, etc.

> > If the site doesn't help fix the problem then the next thing to try is
> > to
> > download and install the free Nero Fast Burn Plug-In. (Here:
> > <http://www.wmplugins.com/ItemDetail.aspx?ItemID=228>) This should work,
> > the
> > only problem is it will not burn DRM-enabled WMA's. Such as those
> > purchased
> > from sites like Napster, MusicNow, Wal-Mart, etc.

> > until we get a better burner. Nero 6 Ultra Edition is a great program
