does open WMP11 and show the movie, but not in full screen, even though

I added /fullscreen to the shortcut.

If it did work, would it stay full screen if I stopped and started the movie

within WMP?

What I really want to do is force WMP11 to show full screen every time a movie plays. I will be playing the same movie over and over but don't want to

have to hit play and also full screen to play it on the projector. Mainly because the remote control I have bought doesn't have a control for full screen, only play and stop.
