This won't help you guys much but here is the latest reponse from JVC. I think they have thrown in the towel. I don't think "MPEG4" is specific enough to help me out so it is all up to you guys now. You are my heros!

After further review the video clip files stored with this camcorder are compatible with MPEG4 players. Which player to use specifily JVC will not be able to assist you with. Once again I have done some personal research and found a lot of freeware programs that might play back files.

Popular players I came across are quick time and divx player. Here is a link to better assist you:

Where does it say MP4S is DivX? It's the old Microsoft fourCC. I can double-check the fourCC registrations if you want, but I'm pretty sure about this.

I think DivX only registered DIVX and DX50... ?

I think possibly the simplest way to repair that would be to put DivX on there – it should enable MPEG4 playback of pretty much all types

That's quite a common codec for downloaded AVIs too, so it's generally useful to have. There's no cost for just the codec part of DivX.

The MP4S code, now I come to look it up, should be DivX 4 (I thought it was MS MPEG for some reason last night) and DivX6 is backwards compatible with that.
