 - > The info you need is in the EULA, about the second paragraph down. To read
 - > the EULA on your computer, open any component of Office (Word, Excel, etc.)
 - > and click on Help. Select "About" from the drop down menu and you'll see a
 - > link to the EULA, click on that and you'll probably see that you're correct,
 - > if you have the retail version you can install on one desktop and one laptop.
 - >
 - > Are you getting the message only when you open a component on the desktop or
 - > do you get the same message on the laptop as well?
 - >
 - > Did it activate OK?
 - >
 - > You might try removing and re-installing on the desktop if it's the only one
 - > causing the problem, not a fix, just something that sometimes works when
 - > strange things happen.
 - >
 - > By the way, I'm not surprised that Comp USA and Micro Center didn't have a
 - > clue, license questions are really not their area of expertise, it's pretty
 - > much a question for Microsoft or for here.
