> From my typing class (some quarter century ago) I learnt about the shift  
> keys. They're the ones with a fat, upward pointing arrow, found at the  
> lower left and right corners of the keyboard. To capitalize a letter,  
> while typing it you keep one shift key depressed with the pinkie of the  
> "free hand" (the one not typing the letter).

> From experience I learnt to hate typing aides in general, and auto  
> capitalize in particular: In Norwegian (and to my knowledge, most  
> languages using the latin alphabet) some abbreviations are ended with a  
> full stop. Autocaps kicks in. Ordinal numbers are marked with a trailing  
> full stop. Autocaps kicks in again. Omissions are marked with ellipsis  
> (...). Need I say what would happen?

>

> I know. Office 2003 has improved the tracking of autocorrection to near  
> perfection. Still, if you have the full use of your hands I suggest you  
> learn to type properly. That said, Rob's advice on seeing the "tools" menu

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> instead of the "insert" menu will most likely help you fix the problem.
