When you install Office 2003 on the computer with Office 2000 installed, the installation program will delete Office 2000 for while transferring all your settings to Office 2003.

After you install Office 2003 and activate, open any Office 2003 applications and go to Help, About {the application}. There you will find a link to your EULA. The EULA will explain the limitations on installing and using Office 2003 on your desktop and your laptop. You will need your Office 2000 CD to install Office 2003 Upgrade on your laptop.
