- > *After successfully setting up the Public Outlook Security Settings folder*
- > *and publishing the security form to automatically allow Simple MAPI*
- > *access,*
- > *one workstation now allows the program to send emails without the*
- > *Confirmation messages appearing, however another workstation doesn't.*
- > *It turns out that the, for the workstation that isn't working correctly,*
- > *that the mail is delivered to a local PST file instead of the Exchange*
- > *mailbox.*
- > *On the first machine, the email is delivered to the Exchange Mailbox.*

- > *I finally tracked down a KBase article that contained the specific cases*
- > *when the security settings won't work.*
- > *One of the cases is... if mail is delivered to a local folder (PST),*
- > *Outlook doesn't check the Public Outlook Security Settings folder.*
- > *Now I know why I keep getting the confirmation messages on this*
- > *workstation.*

- > *Does anyone know if there is a work-around for this?*
- > *If not, I'll have to use something like ClickYes.*
