>> *including sub-folders.*  
>>  
>> *– Recently tried to link a Yahoo! email account to the same Outlook*  
>> *session.*  
>>  
>> *– Sending/ receiving fine, but there are no sub-folders and it is*  
>> *throwing the mail into a general "inbox." Would like to be able to*  
>> *create a folder that says "Yahoo" and link it to that email account,*  
>> *(Hotmail has a folder that says "Hotmail" and contains all of my*  
>> *sub-folders).*  
>  
> *The difference is that the Hotmail account is an HTTP (WebDAV) account and*  
> *the messages remain in the Hotmail server, with Outlook presenting you a*  
> *view into that remote message store. The Yahoo! account, on the other hand,*  
> *is a POP account and messages generally don't remain on the POP server.*  
> *They get downloaded to your Inbox.*  
>  
> *You can create a rule that will move those messages to another folder, which*  
> *you can label "Yahoo", if you'd like.*
