> ... anywhere in the headers.

> MailWasher allows me to do SPAM filtering with regular expressions, but
> their definition of the "from" field is the same as Outlooks: just the
> email address portion.

> I suppose I'm wishing for the rules to implement "where the from field
> contains specific words"
