We are running Exchange 6.5 on Server 2003. The machines in question are joined to the domain and the user is logging in to the domain.

I have yet to create a new mail profile for the user though. I was hoping this would be as easy as some checkbox buried somewhere, but I will see what happens when we create a new mail profile.

Click Tools>E-mail Accounts>Next. Select the Exchange account and click CHange. Click More Settings, then the Security tab. Uncheck "Always prompt for a username and password" and see if that helps. Also try selecting "Kerberos/NTLM Password Authentication" in the "Logon network security" drop-down. This are the settings I have and I never have to enter my Exchange credentials.
