> > 6315. I often use a Bluetooth headset (Jabra 250).

> > When I am using the headset and I use voice command to "Call Bob Smith at Work", the voice command works ok, however the feedback, "Call Bob Smith at Work...Correct?" prompt only comes out of the Ipaq rear speaker, so it is rather hard to hear. Of course, it is expecting an acknowledgement, but it does not send the sound through the Bluetooth headset.
