Maureen,

Sorry to hear that you are still having so many problems. I suspect that the problem is at the webhost and probably domain register level. s174331851.websitehome.co.uk is probably your Temporary URL. Did you go to the web site where you purchased your domain name and change your domain name's DNS setting to point to the 1&1 DNS servers? When did you do that? Sometimes it will take a day or two before the change takes effect. Go back and double check that you didn't make a mistake with changing the DNS servers.

When I try your domain address in FireFox I get: Server not Found. Firefox can't find the server at www,s174331851.websitehome.co.uk.

I have just spent 45min with 1&1 and we have published my web site. However, although we uploaded all the HTML files and I told him that it needed to be published unframed, I still have the same problem with IE as I had before. If you type in the new web space address into the address bar, i.e. s174331851.websitehome.co.uk it will bring up all my web site and it works perfectly, but if you type in my domain name, only the Home page is visible.

I have now emailed them with the problem to see if they can sort it out....unless you have any suggestions of course?

Yet another whole morning spent on this....it's driving me mad!!

It's me again and I've still got problems. I have upgraded my package with 1&1 and they have given me a new web space address, so, all I have to do is publish my web site to that and change the direction of my domain name and I'm done. Easy? No....

I have saved my web site to HTML but when I publish it to the wizard it asks me where I want to publish the files and says I can select a service provider. In the box for service providers it has already put MSN Groups, which I don't want, but it won't let me delete or change this. If I ignore it and just click on next, a box appears asking me where I want the files stored and says 'I can store them in MSN or My Web Documents or any other group I create'. Again it has already put in 'Create a new MSN Group to share your files' but will not let me delete or change it. So, what will happen if I ignore this MSN thing and just continue?

I have just found another grey hair...and I'm too young to go grey so please help!!

Whoops. It sounds like you chose FireFox as your default browser when you installed it. You needed to watch the options as you installed it. I am not sure of how you change it now. Perhaps right click the IE icon, properties, and under the Programs tab, click Reset Web Settings, and/or the box

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beside
"Internet Explorer should
check to see whether...".
Then try the
icon
again.
If that doesn't work, then
perhaps delete the icon, and
using
Windows
Explorer browse to
C:\Program Files\Internet
Explorer\iexplore.exe
and
right
click that file, drag to the
desktop, and choose Create
Shortcut.
Set the
properties. For a Firefox
shortcut, C:\Program
Files\Mozilla
Firefox\firefox.exe , right
click and drag to desktop,
create short
cut.

Then if none of that works, I
guess I would try removing
FireFox
through
add
and remove, check the
shortcut for IE again, and if
it works, then
reinstall
FireFox and this time make
sure it doesn't install as the
default
browser.

You gotta be careful when
you install programs. I
always use Custom
install
if I have the choice so I can
look at all the options before
installing.
And, I always manually set
a system restore point
before installing,

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just
in
case.

As per the pictures...you
remember me talking about
how Publisher
produces
"smarter" code for IE, and
"dumber" code for other
browsers? Well it
also
produces different graphics
for different browsers, and
in your
case, the
images are not that great in
FireFox. Just one of the
limitations of
using
Publisher for building a
website, that you will have
to live with
unless
you
import your images instead
of embedding them...but
that is another
issue,
for another time.
