There are three articles here about uploading. If you aren't using a form, then the FTP uploading protocol is probably the easiest, as it does not require the use of FPSE. Read here:

Also you might want to just skip that and download and use a dedicated ftp client, such as Filezilla, which is available for free:

<http://filezilla.sourceforge.net/>

It would be a pain, but you could create a subfolder called index_files on your site, and then upload each of the files one by one. Or, you could choose to not use the subfolder option and then you could also just upload each file. Look under Tools > Options > Web tab and uncheck "Organize supporting files...", and while you are there, uncheck "Rely on VML...", and "Allow PNG...", which will help lighten your html output and improve the loading time of your pages.
