My answer was not complete.

When you Publish to the Web and produce your web files, you will get an index.htm file and a index_files folder which will contain all your other pages and supporting graphics. Those are the 40+ individual files you are talking about. There is no single html file. I think it would be worth your time to go back and read and study the material at: Prepare, publish, and maintain your Publisher Web site:

From that article:

"Whether you publish to the Web or to your computer, Office Publisher 2007 assembles all the related files that it creates in a single folder. The files that Office Publisher 2007 creates include the other HTML pages that make up your site, GIF and JPEG graphics that you use on your pages, and any files for embedded sounds."

After you download and install FileZilla, then you will upload the index.htm file (your home page) and the index_files folder containing....yes, the 40+ files.
