Thomboy,

I think you will find that once you get FileZilla installed and learn how to use it, you will find it easier and faster. Be sure to download the documentation/instructions.

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As per your other question, I am going to guess about what the problem is since you did not provide a link. I am guessing that your monitor on your desktop is set at 96 dpi, and your wife's laptop is set at 120 dpi. You can right click your desktop, properties, settings, advanced to check this. Many of the new laptops are coming set at 120 dpi from the factory. Unfortunately Publisher outputs everything including the text at 96 dpi, and when you view it at 120 dpi the page can exhibit the symptoms you describe. And there is no fix...

If that is not the problem, then post a link to a page where you are having the problem, and be specific about what you are seeing.

On my website, too many text box and picture images overlap. Is there any easy fix without manually using Design Checker to find and fix the problems?
Too many viewers talk about the overlaps, but I don't see them on my computer running VISTA Ultimate with a screen resolution of 1680 X 1050 pixels. When I use my wife's laptop, running Windows XP, with a screen resolution of 1440X 900 pixels, I do.

When you "Publish to the Web" Publisher will produce an "index.htm" file (your home page) and a "index_files" folder that contains the supporting graphics and additional pages to your site.

Try logging on to your FTP site BEFORE you try to drag and drop BOTH the new

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index.htm file and the index_files folder to the FTP site.
Sometimes it
helps if you delete your old index.htm file and index_files
folder from
the
FTP site before uploading the new. If that makes you
paranoid, then just
rename the old files, and leave them where they are in case
something
goes
wrong.

Consider downloading, installing and using FileZilla for your
FTP client.

| Last night I merely  
dragged the index\_files  
created when I built my  
website

| in Publisher 2007 from a  
folder on my hard drive to  
the FTP folder,

and

the

| existing website pages  
were changed were needed.

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I assumed that the  
| index\_files in the FTP  
folder on my computer were  
replaced by the  
changed  
| index\_files from my  
Publisher file.

| Since I mapped the FTP  
server to drive Z on my PC  
the user name and  
password  
| should allow the pages at  
my website to be modified  
with the changed  
or  
index  
| files --index\_files.  
|  
| It worked once, but never  
again.  
|  
| When I drag the changed  
index\_files from my folder  
on the hard  
drive,  
| titled, HOA wegsite 1.pub,  
to the FTP folder on my  
computer, I see a  
window  
| indicating the the files are  
being copied, but it goes on  
and on for  
hours.  
| Last night I did the same  
thing, and in 15 minutes, the  
website  
pages  
were  
| updated, and changed.

| Am I on cloud nine, or is  
what I did possible?

| I hope the definition of my  
procedure was clear enough  
to get an  
answer.
