Hey, David, many, many thanks for looking at the Website. I think you are right on wth your assessment, and that is actually good to hear. I have not yet used the "nudge" feature.

Does the nudge feature know how much the nudge needs to be to eliminate overlap issues, or do I keep looking at the website, or better, should I use the website preview tool? BTW, I am starting to hear that the viewers who saw the overlaps were using either Netscape or Mozilla as their browser, and that will make a HUGE difference.

I guess when I downloaded all the "information" for FileZilla, I didn't know which sets I actually needed. Please look at the list I left with my reply for Rob; probably only one or two of them is needed for the FTP Client. I didn't see at the FileZilla site any directions for which set of instructions would be needed for the client versus the server FTP software.

I was almost ready to go back to using Dreamweaver for my website software, but like all learning curves, because it was steeper, not that Publisher is bad software, but because I can't forget my old, and outdated habits.

Like I said, thanks for coming back to review my comments.

Using the Publisher process to upload the index.ftm and index_files leaves a lot to be desired. I know that once I get the correct copy of FileZilla, and begin to use it, I will be less frustrated with this small, and static website. Only two pages will ever change.

Thanks, and I will most likely be back at the watering hole again when I hit another snag.

The good news is that I guessed wrong. Your problem is simply that you need to make your text boxes a bit bigger and potentially move some other design

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elements away from the text boxes. I only spotted a few, so it shouldn't be that hard to lengthen the text boxes a bit. Also be sure to note the "nudge" tool. It is handy for moving things just a few ticks.

As Rob suggested, it appears that you downloaded the wrong version of FileZilla. You want the client side, not the server side.

I think you will find that once you get FileZilla installed and learn how to use it, you will find it easier and faster. Be sure to download

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the
documentation/instructions.

As per your other question, I am going to guess about what
the problem is
since you did not provide a link. I am guessing that your
monitor on your
desktop is set at 96 dpi, and your wife's laptop is set at 120
dpi. You
can
right click your desktop, properties, settings, advanced to
check this.

Many
of the new laptops are coming set at 120 dpi from the
factory.
Unfortunately
Publisher outputs everything including the text at 96 dpi, and
when you
view
it at 120 dpi the page can exhibit the symptoms you describe.
And there
is
no fix...

If that is not the problem, then post a link to a page where
you are
having
the problem, and be specific about what you are seeing.

When you "Publish to the
Web" Publisher will
produce an "index.htm"
file
(your home page) and a
"index_files" folder that
contains the
supporting
graphics and additional
pages to your site.

Try logging on to your FTP
site BEFORE you try to
drag and drop BOTH
the
new
index.htm file and the
index_files folder to the
FTP site. Sometimes
it
helps if you delete your old
index.htm file and
index_files folder
from
the
FTP site before uploading
the new. If that makes you
paranoid, then
just
rename the old files, and
leave them where they are in
case something
goes

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wrong.

Consider downloading,
installing and using FileZilla
for your FTP
client.
