- > has admin rights to the server. If Inbox Mgr successfully creates the CAP
- > share then once it has completed updating it go ahead and remove the CAP
- > role and see if Inbox Mgr successfully clears out the entries from the
- > registry. If this does not work then I suggest contacting product support
- > services.
