Today I created a regular software distribution package in an attempt to install patch MS03-011 for Windows XP SP1. I used the same syntax `msjavwu.exe /c:"javatrig.exe /exe_install /l /q" /q:a /r:n` that worked when I ran it from the command line and is documented in KB304930. This package too timed out. Why won't this run through SMS 2003? Thank you.

> *There was some confusion on my part regarding the correct syntax for this*  
> *patch. Verified experimentally that correct syntax is msjavwu.exe*  
> */c:"javatrig.exe /exe\_install /l /q" /q:a /r:n.*  
> *The patch was installed quietly in the background with no user interaction*  
> *when using this syntax from the command line. However, when using this*  
> *syntax through SMS, the patch did not install. The PatchInstall.log*  
> *indicates FAILSAFE TIMEOUT for this patch.*  
>  
> *I monitored the PCs Task Manager both when I ran this command from the*  
> *command line and when SMS was running the advertisement. When running from*  
> *the command line I remember seeing Javatrig.exe using significant CPU*  
> *resources. However, when running the SMS advertisement, MSJavwu.exe,*  
> *Javatrig.exe, and PatchInstall.exe were listed, but using very little CPU*  
> *resources. (It was actually showing zero.) I don't understand what the*  
> *problem is. As I mentioned before, other patches that I set up previously*  
> *ran well. This particular one is a problem. Thanks.*
