That seemed to work very well thank you. That seemed to fix my immediate issue very nicely. I am still wondering why the original didn't work. I did notice that I pasted the wrong script the first time. The script that was using was extremely similar your to yours (it included descriptive messages before the quit statements). I think I found the issue that I was having. I was downloading the package and then running it from the client. I noticed that in the CAS.Log file that there were references from my previous run that said:

```
Cache is in Use. DeleteCacheItem cannot proceed.  
CacheManager.DeleteCacheItem failed with 0x80008203
```

So I am assuming because I was running the script from cache all of the cache content was locked and unavailable for use. When I ran it manually even though the command was the same SMS was not running it so the cache was available for deletion. Does this sound plausible?

Sounds entirely plausible and completely possible ;)

I believe it would be a lot like standing on a rug, then attempting to pull it out from under you.

We use the run from dp for that operation.
