Hey Tom,

Pardon me for jumping in so late.

RDA with SQL Server – IIS is required
RDA with Access – IIS is NOT required

ADS (Access Database Synchronizer) or SWA (Sync With Access) comes with
a
HTTP Listner which is sufficient enough for RDA with Access.

Please note that ADS is meant to sync SQL CE on DEVICE with Access on
DESKTOP.

The moment you cradle it, HTTP Listner starts running. To make sure the
communication happens smoothly, you may need to open the port for HTTP
Listner packet reception port (its not port 80) but some ephemeral range
port number.

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Please use MSDN forum as we will watch that closely.
