Hi,

I have installed SQL 2000 Server on my machine with Default Instance and a named instance viz., Instance1. I tried upgrading

the Database Engine of the Default instance to SQL 2005 Server (using the 2005 Set up CD). It was upgraded successfully.

I tried upgrading the named instance's Database engine from SQL 2000 to SQL 2005 server. After selecting the Database Engine

component and clicking Next, I got the following error:
