I simply followed the steps in here for assigning file and registry permissions on both nodes and removed the service account from the local Administrators group when I'd finished. Works a treat.

Note that the service account needs read permissions to the whole of the drive with the master and TempDB devices not just the folder they are in and full control on the folders containing the data devices.
