Thank you for using Newsgroup.

Do you use the SQL SERVER 2000 or SQL SERVER 2005?

Actually SQL SERVER 2000 has two types of authentication: Windows authentication and mixed authentication. If you do not use the domain account to login in the Windows, you cannot use the Windows authentication type to pass through the SQL SERVER, however you can use the SQL SERVER authentication to access the SQL SERVER from the Windows XP machine. To do so, you need to do the following things:

1. Enable the SQL SERVER to use the mixed mode. (in the SQL SERVER Enterprise Manager, right click your server->click properties->Security, select SQL Server and Windows under the Authentication)
2. Set up a SQL SERVER login account. (extend your server in the Enterprise Manager, Security->Logins, set up your sa account, and you can use this sa account to access the SQL SERVER)
