If this is just a straight import, look to using FTP if the daemon is running on the AS/400. You may need to get a userid/password on the AS/400 for this task.

If it's bidirectional interchange your looking for, look into loading the AS/400 client with the database connectivity packages onto the SQL Server itself. Talk to your AS/400 systems administrator for this client.

Loading up Host Integration Server would be such a waste of time and resource just for one particular task.
