This is a known bug that impacts named instances. You should be able to connect to default instances disconnected from the network.

> Are you by any chance running on a laptop that is intermittently
> connected to a domain? I am in this situation and am seeing similar
> intermittent issues, in my case it only happens when I am disconnected
> from the network so it should not affect a normal server.

>

> I think in this situation it has to do with logging on using cached
> domain credentials, but it also seems to depend on when the AS service
> was started. I think if the AS service could contact the domain
> controller when it started up it will work OK against cached domain
> credentials. I suspend my laptop when I travel between home and the
> office, so it is hard for me to keep track of when I last rebooted. :)

> If I have to start up my machine away from the office I have found the
> following work around.

>

> I am running WinXP and I hold the shift key down, right click on
> Management Studio or BIDS and select the "Run as..." option. This allows
> me to run either of these apps using the credentials of a local user,
> even though I am logged on to my machine with my cached domain
> credentials.

>

> When I can figure out a simple set of steps to reproduce this issue I
> plan to log it with MS, but it is a pain to test as you have to connect,
> restart, disconnect, restart and at the moment I am working off site for

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> the next few weeks.
