However it is not prefixed with Interop.

Inside the Visual C# .NET project, you add a reference to the Microsoft SQL Merge Control 8.0 COM object, and then add the following code:

```
using System;  
using System.Runtime.InteropServices;  
using SQLMEXLib;
```

As far as I recall, adding the reference imports the type library, so assuming the COM object is registered (it should be from the SQL Installation) there's no need to use regsvr32.exe
