You need to use nt authentication end to end. The storing of passwords was disabled in SP2 of SQL 2000 IIRC as it was a security risk.

It started the sync at the correct time, but it asked for the publisher/distributer passwords and then asked for them each time it tried to sync after that. I looked all over the place but could find no way to get it to remember the password.

Is there anyway to get it to remember the password so that we could you this to schedule syncs on systems that only have SQL Server Express installed?
