Why not just use Enterprise Manager, or even better, Query Analyzer from your client workstation to do the restore? Do you need to use Remote Desktop? Do you have a roaming profile on the domain? If you map the drives using Remote Desktop, log off and then log on again, do they still disappear?

When restoring over the network, you should always use a UNC name anyway, as this reduces exposure to bugs. Mapped drive letters can change, or even disappear. Try using a UNC name, i.e.

\\servername\share\folder\file
