Hi Matt,

It's probably that when you're logging into the system on that desktop you are logging into the local computer instead of the domain. So log back off, hit CTRL-ALT-DEL click on options and make sure that you log into the domain and not the local computer. That should solve it.

Matt Ziegler wrote:

We have a SQL Server 2005 SP2 server that also functions as a secondary domain controller in active directory. Everything works extremely well except for 1 bug that was found today. Currently windows authentication is the only method. When creating a new sql login either physically at the server or through a remote desktop connection the user is found in the domain and works just fine.

However when trying to do the same process using management studio from a desktop connecting to the sql instance as soon as you try to find the user in the domain you get this error: "The program cannot open the required dialog box because it cannot determine whether the computer name "COMPNAME" is joined to a domain."

I have sysadmin privileges on the sql server and if I use my login name on the server physically I am able to create logins.

Any help would be greatly appreciated.
