Hi,

I have a SQL Server that is causing some issues when developers attempt to load SQL profiler. I am an admin on the server and have no problems at all.

I have read many articles about granting permission to "Alter Trace" but I have done that with no joy. I am wondering if this is due to the way we give access to the servers. We use Active Directory groups and add any developers who need access to this group. The group has SysAdmin access on the server and each of the developers can do anything on the server except 2 things. They can't login with SQL Profiler and they can't import SSIS packages. These two things may be related or not but I'm wondering if giving access through Active directory groups is causing the problem??

If I add a developer to the Local Administrator group they can run profiler. So what permissions do I need to give someone to be able to do this without NT administrator access??
