I'm learning VBScript (ASP.Classic, WSH) through the "School of Hard Knocks". Right now I am confused about the different methods of connecting to an SQL Server. That is where and when (or not) to use them. I have been trying to read up on the following methods:

ADO:

e.g. `Set objSQLconn = CreateObject("ADODB.Connection")`

SQLDMO:

e.g. `Set objSQLserver = CreateObject("SQLDMO.SqlServer")`

SQLOLE:

e.g. `Set objSQLServer = CreateObject("SQLOLE.SqlServer")`

When do and don't you use each of these?

Are there any good web sites with tutorials on these methods?

Are there any more way to connect to an SQL server?

I've got so many acronyms swimming inside my head I don't know what anything stands for anymore.
