

Re: Spin/ spout BCDL to sql server Swap (how do i stop sharepoint using BCDL?)

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I am not sure if I understand your question.

Spin/Spout just copies the documents and meta info into SQL. It does no redirection. If you still have the BCDL installed and users are editing that version of the document they will not be going into SQL.

Your users should access the documents in the location you 'Spouted' them too. If it is confusing to your users I would remove the BCDL if you are no longer using it.

> Hi,
> I've upgarded from Sharepoint portal server 2001 to 2003 and have
> managed to install the optional BCDL components (backwards compatible
> document library). We also use as a configuration database etc, a
> remote sql server database. I have imported topics into the portal (I
> have created virtual servers and thus one portal per workspace in
> 2001). I can view the documents etc without a problem. I run
> Spout.exe against the 2003 BCDL and spin.exe. All works ok. THEN, we
> check the documents exist in SQL server, and they are there, but, when
> we update a document through the portal, there is no change to the SQL
> server data. i.e. the portal seems to still be pointing to the BCDL.
> Any ideas how i can stop this/ force it to point to sql server? I
> checked the components on the server admin page in sharepoint all
> reference the remote sql server correctly.
> thanks
