> to
> go to the site and NOT supply logon info. In addition, there is a virtual
> web
> inside this main web that has been completely unaccessable, even when I
> supplied by administrator login information. After removing the hover
> button,
> this page too was available now. NOW for the bad news: I went to another
> workstation and the success was not global! I believe my workstation was
> using Windows Authentication to allow me in. From the other workstation
