I have tried putting the sites in both "trusted sites" and "local intranet" I have tried on two different MOSS installations and one WSS installation. It is not working on 7 different Vista Clients. But does work on 1 Vista client and xp clients. I can not find any IE settings that are unique. I have seen other postings where people are having similar problems. But I have not seen any resolutions.

Yes I am using Windows integrated authentication only. I have also tried using Kerberos.

Yes, I can verify that trusted sites has been effective in delivering the necessary access to users. Another thought occurred to me as well. Are you using the default iis configuration of Windows integrated authentication only? or is there some other type of access? are you using ntlm or kerberos for access? Just a couple more areas for you to poke around. Have you had any luck resolving this as yet?
