All your original question seemed to be asking is

Can I have a group of users with permission to access Site 1 but who don't have permission to access Site2?

Sites can have specific permissions.

So you can specify exactly who is allowed to access Site 1 (one list which can include individual users; Site Groups; AD Groups) and who is allowed to access Site 2 (a different list of individual users; Site Groups; AD Groups)

Thusfor instance the list for Site 1 could include Site Group 1 but not Site Group 2 and the list for Site 2 could include Site Group 2 but not Site Group 1. (or AD Groups or individual users)

Does that make it clearer?

If not someone else will have to come in.

Design – Can view, add, update, delete, approve, and customize.

Manage Hierarchy – Can create sites and edit pages, list items, and
documents.

Approve – Can edit and approve pages, list items, and documents.

Contribute – Can view, add, update, and delete.

Read – Can view only.

Restricted Read – Can view pages and documents, but cannot view
historical versions or review user rights...

View Only – Members of this group can view pages, list items, and

View Usage Data – View reports on Web site usage.

Create Subsites – Create subsites such as team sites, Meeting
Workspace sites, and Document Workspace sites.

Manage Web Site – Grants the ability to perform all administration tasks for the Web site as well as manage content.

Add and Customize Pages – Add, change, or delete HTML pages or Web Part Pages, and edit the Web site using a Windows SharePoint Services-compatible editor.

Apply Themes and Borders – Apply a theme or borders to the entire Web site.

Apply Style Sheets – Apply a style sheet (.CSS file) to the Web site.

Create Groups – Create a group of users that can be used anywhere within the site collection.

Browse Directories – Enumerate files and folders in a Web site using SharePoint Designer and Web DAV interfaces.

View Pages – View pages in a Web site.

Enumerate Permissions – Enumerate permissions on the Web site, list, folder, document, or list item.

Browse User Information – View information about users of the Web site.

Manage Alerts – Manage alerts for all users of the Web site.

Use Remote Interfaces – Use SOAP, Web DAV, or SharePoint Designer interfaces to access the Web site.

Use Client Integration Features – Use features which launch client applications. Without this permission, users ...

Open – Allows users to open a Web site, list, or folder in order to access items inside that container.

Edit Personal User Information – Allows a user to change his or her own user information, such as adding a picture.
