- > (Basically you shoudl in both cases consider the following basic difference
- > to a "current site vi FrontPage". In either of the two "SharePoint 2003"
- > products you will NOT be creating a site with FP 2003, instead you will be
- > installing the WSS/SPS 2003 application (and you install it *without* the FP
- > Extensions. You can THEN use FrontPage 2003 to administer the site (and it
- > is very good and virtually essential for that)
- >
- > In both WSS and SPS 2003 all the information loaded to the site is stored in
- > SQL Server 2K. It is unwise to "just connect to what we have" when using
- > WSS – when using SPS 2003 you can via it's Search routine access information
- > stored in "what we have" but even there it's worth considering transferring
- > them to full control of the SPS 2003 system (but ask there!).
- >
- > The SQL Server can in the case of WSS (and I assume for SPS 2003) be on the
- > same server (as can in both cases the default database system WMSDE/MSDE
- > 2.0.) Performance reasons might make you want to move the database to
- > another server however.
